





# MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT Rebuilding

I was about to leave a restaurant in New Orleans when my waiter, Rick, complained about the lack of business. "This lunch hour was so lousy my pockets are empty," he said.

I motioned Rick back to the table. "So times are tough?"

"Lunchtime used to be full of tourists and businesspeople, conventioneers," he responded. "Now only three tables are taken in this huge place." It was a full three years after Hurricane Katrina.

Rick had a two-story house that had suffered massive water damage. Even with a second job, he couldn't afford to fix it. Times were tough.

Then brightening a bit, he told me that the most effective institutions in the city were the churches. After Katrina, it was church volunteers who were bussed in to help rebuild (pictured above), and who manned the Red Cross efforts.

Summing up his situation, Rick found strength where so many of his city did. "God and my church definitely keep me centered," Rick said.

David Singer visited New Orleans to report on the area's continued need for God's Word. The American Bible Society had provided churches and ministries in New Orleans with more than 1.5 million Scriptures before the storms. Since Hurricanes Fay, Gustav, Hannah and Ike, more than 500,000 Scriptures have been given to Gulf Coast residents.

#### FRANCE

#### **Braille Celebration**

Louis Braille was three years old when an accident in his father's harness workshop left him permanently blind. He was sent to a village priest for private tutoring. By the age of 15, he developed a new reading and writing system for the blind, using raised dots to represent letters.

The bicentenary of Louis Braille's birth (1809) will be commemorated around the world, and especially in his birthplace of Coupvray, France. Braille's invention of a reading system for the blind gave millions access to written knowledge.

The American Bible Society has long supported Bible literacy for the blind, through the translation and production of Braille Bibles and through innovations that provide the Word of God in audio formats.

#### NIGERIA

#### A Happy End

In Tonti, Nigeria, a man is so moved by watching *The JESUS Film* that he expresses his faith in Christ. The moment is life-changing. "He used to talk to me harshly, drink excessively and never cared to stay home," says his wife. "Now he is changed. Please kindly teach me, too. I want to follow you people."

The couple began to attend a newly planted church in Tonti. The church is an outgrowth of the hard work of End to End, an innovative church-planting project that brings international and local partners together to fulfill Jesus' commission to share the gospel.

This initiative engages the unreached and predominantly oral people of the Taraba region with *The JESUS Film*, the Faith Comes By Hearing® Audio Scriptures, and Bibles in local languages. The goal is to bring those who show an interest into vibrant New Life Groups or churches. There they are taught the story of the Bible, and many join new churches, like the one in Tonti.




Earlier issues of

Editor-in-chief Tonya Wilder-Butts, who is also the mission manager for at-risk youth, says that this issue explores the idea of making dreams come true. "Now we're addressing a transformative process," she says, "recognizing the gifts God has instilled in each one of us and living up to our full potential, according to his plan."

The magazine is an outreach ministry that consistently reaches people hungry for God's Word. Tom Trageser, a ministry network leader with the American Bible Society, was at the annual WOW (Winning Our World) Jam event in Charlotte, N.C. last August. While he was assisting a donor, he watched a couple in their twenties with three young children approach the *Elementz* tent. The young man said to the young woman, "Honey, do you remember the picture of the cross that I sent to you while I was in prison? Well, I got it out of this magazine's last issue."

#### NEW MEXICO

#### On the Reservation

"The needs here are staggering," says John Dillard. This summer John, his wife Tami and their two teenage sons set out for Pueblo Pintado, N.M. — deep in the heart of Navajo country. For the second year in a row, the family was helping run a weeklong daily vacation Bible school for local kids.

With rising unemployment, substance abuse, gambling and isolation, the community faced challenges that could only be met with a message of hope. Last year the Dillards had nothing tangible to leave behind after their Scripture-intensive week ended. Tami, who organized this year's mission, wanted to change that.



She searched the Internet for Bibles and found the American Bible Society (ABS). After speaking with her, ABS offered to donate

200 illustrated children's Bibles to the students in their ministry.

Word about the daily vacation Bible school spread quickly in the tightly knit Navajo community, and attendance grew daily. By week's end, it had grown by 50 percent, and the Scripture-centered program attracted 60 children from ages four to 15.

#### FLIPS AHOY HAS A WINNER!

Ashley Phillips (pictured) of Wagoner, Okla., has even more to be thankful for. Her entry was selected randomly in the first Flips Ahoy contest hosted on ShareYourStoryNow.org. She and



her fellow contestants had submitted audio, video and written accounts of how God's Word is at work in people's lives. Ashley

told how God is healing her from the effects of her father's damaging words with Song of Songs 4.7. She received a new Flip™ Ultra Video Camcorder. A donation of \$1,000 is being made in her name to the *Light of the Amazon*, a boat ministry of the Bible Society of Brazil, supported by ABS.

# Bible Q&A

### Answers to your Scripture questions

Why did God choose Canaan to be his nation on this earth rather than Iraq — the old Eden, which is really rich in oil?

When Abraham was called by God (Genesis 12.1-3) to migrate to Canaan, it was a land of flourishing city-states at the crossroads of the ancient world. The religion was developing a trend toward monotheism. The movement into Canaan was a step in the divine plan toward the redemption of man through Christ. The circumstances of the location and a population not adverse to monotheism were a fertile atmosphere for belief in Yahweh — which the clans brought with them. In summary, though we can't speak for God, it seems the divine purpose of the migration from Mesopotamia, modern day Iraq, to Canaan was not only to find a rich environment in which the people could prosper, but for the people and the religion to prosper and grow for the redemption of mankind.

# Riches for the Least of Them

The American Bible Society joins forces with The Salvation Army

THE RESULTS OF A GROWING partnership between the American Bible Society (ABS) and The Salvation Army make for really good news. The Bible Society is supplying the Army's "foot soldiers" with Scripture resources for a full range of programs that bring life change to those wrestling with poverty.

#### **Mission: Literacy**

Failing schools, chaotic home environments and families in which English is not the primary language undermine the literacy skills of impoverished urban youth. Years ago ABS saw an opportunity to use Bible stories as the core of a new literacy curriculum. Experts worked with the Bank Street College of Education to make Mission: Literacy a reality. A three-level series of booklets, each consisting of 30 Bible stories, helped to significantly enhance the reading skills of children and adults.

Dawn Sharp, an educator and consultant for The Salvation Army's New Jersey Division, says, "Mission: Literacy perfectly matches the dual mission of The Salvation Army: to minister to the body by providing social services and to minister to the soul by introducing people to Jesus Christ."

The Bible Society also promotes Bible literacy for kids from poor urban neighborhoods who attend Salvation Army summer

camps. Each child is given a knapsack filled with school supplies — and a *Contemporary English Version* Bible from the Bible Society.

"As a young kid I can remember my nervousness each year, facing the first day of school," says Mr. Patrick Patey, representing the Dallas—Fort Worth Salvation Army. "These kids face the same anxiety, but without having proper supplies."

#### **Christmas Compassion**

Maritza Reyes, a mother of four who also cares for her sister's daughters, was overjoyed to receive a Bible for Christmas. The gift came from the Angel Tree

program (not to be confused with the Prison Fellowship program of the same name), which brightens the holidays for struggling families. Churches and welfare agencies identify recipients, and volunteers visit their homes to assess the needs of the young children. A paper angel for each child is then hung in an area shopping mall for donors to "adopt." In all, 300,000 gifts were donated.

In the Dallas–Fort Worth area, thousands of volunteers distributed Angel Tree gifts to 49,000 poverty-stricken children from 15,000 families. The American Bible Society was pleased to add Spanish and English Bibles to donations of toys, clothes and grocery vouchers. "The gifts will put smiles on my children's faces," says Carmen Correas, a mother whose husband is in jail.

When Hurricane Katrina struck New Orleans, ABS rushed 5,000 copies of the Scripture Portion "God Is Our Shelter and Strength" to Salvation Army soldiers working along the Gulf Coast. In the years since, the Bible Society has provided an additional 6,000 of these Portions. In anticipation of the need for quick response to future emergencies, additional copies of the Scripture booklets are en route for storage with other emergency supplies.

#### **Serving the Poor**

The Bible Society donates Scriptures for other Salvation Army outreaches as well. The Dallas–Fort Worth Metropolitan Command distributed 17,000 ABS English/Spanish New Testaments this past year to people enrolled in substance abuse programs, homeless shelters and women taking refuge from domestic violence.

Chaplain Bella Carroll of the Carr P. Collins Social Service Center in Dallas says, "We give out 20 Bibles a month to people attending church services and Bible studies, but we could double that number if we had more."



#### **BIG LESSONS**

When a second-grader named Carlos first started in Mission: Literacy, he was a bundle of questions. From the moment he began to make progress in learning to read, he was constantly asking his teacher: "Who is God? Was he before everything else? Can he see us all the time?" The more Carlos learned to read the Bible, the more quizzical he became, absorbing each simple answer before jumping to the next. His teacher saw first-hand how the power of the written Word works through this program — God speaking to the heart of a little boy.





#### The Prisoner Pastor

ture in the rural hills of Rwanda, home to 7,400 prisoners. More than half of them are serving sentences related to the 1993 Rwandan genocide, a harrowing time when citizens — many of them Christians — committed unspeakable acts. No one in the country was unaffected.

Within the walls of Gitarama, God's forgiveness and healing power are at work. There are many small churches in the prison, each with its own pastors and teachers. Louis (pictured), the leader of one of the Protestant Christian churches,



explains that the Bible is a very important part of his life and healing. "The Bible gives me peace in my heart," he says.

He finds comfort in the story of Abraham. Though his own story is much different from

that of Abraham, Louis draws strength from God's promise to bless the Hebrew patriarch. He explains that Abraham waited a long time to see fulfillment of God's promise and that he himself must wait patiently as well. "The Bible helps me to be patient and to wait for God's promise," he says.

Scriptures provided by the Bible Society are essential tools for these church leaders. One says, "It is hard to preach and help others learn about God when you don't have a Bible."

#### Reunited in Christ

mmaculé and François (pictured) have been married for 23 years in Rwanda, but many of those years were filled with strife. In 1993, Immaculé became a Christian and had a new vision for her marriage. She tried to be a good wife in the eyes of God and says the Bible, especially Proverbs 31.10-31, gave her strength to keep going every day.

But François wanted nothing to do with Christianity. He explains, "People choose a way in life. I chose a way that was not good." He could not keep a job and would often spend the little money they had on alcohol.

During this time François contracted HIV and through him, so did Immaculé. When she found out, she was devastated. In an act of desperation,



she called her pastor. François agreed to meet with the pastor in the hope that he could solve their domestic problems by making Immaculé change *her* behavior. But the pastor explained that only Jesus could heal the wounds of their marriage. François's heart was softened, and he made a commitment to follow Christ.

God's Spirit quickly began to bear fruit in their marriage and their lives. They attended the Bible Societies' Good Samaritan HIV/AIDS workshop in 2001, which taught them to "look for the people and the problems around you and help them." When Immaculé and François realized that

there were other couples in the same situation, they started a couple's ministry in their church. This ministry led many couples to embrace the love of God in their marriages and live in a way that shares that love with others.

As François says, "All things can become good for those who believe in God."

#### Her Miracle

Behind her radiant smile is a deep wisdom uncommon for her years. Shakera (pictured) is 10 years old. She studies hard in school, especially math and science, because she



wants to design and fly airplanes when she grows up. She says that she has seen God at work in her country, making the sick well again. She experienced this firsthand.

When Shakera was diagnosed with a potentially fatal stomach disease, her parents desperately looked for a cure, without success. As a last resort they took her to Kenya. She explains that they gave her medicine, and they also prayed for her. When asked if she knows anyone whom God has healed, she smiles and states with great confidence, "Me!"

Shakera attends Sunday School with 200 other children, where they read Scripture booklets provided by the Bible Society. There she learns that God loves little children and does miracles. She especially enjoys the story of David. "God can help you overcome the people who are stronger than you," she says.

With an attitude of thankfulness for what she has seen God do in her own life. Shakera is a living testimony to God's work in Rwanda.

#### To Heal the Sick

ne surgeon is making a difference at Gitega Hospital, in a rural area in the heart of Burundi. Gitega is the only medical facility of its kind for many miles.

A year ago Dr. Etiene Bunzirigi began a prayer group. On Wednesday mornings this group prays for the sick. Etiene says, "We pray that the power of the Holy Spirit would cure the diseases that we can't cure ourselves." This prayer group is open to anyone at the hospital: Patients, family members, nurses and doctors frequently attend. The Gitega prayer group has grown to include a Bible study, led by Etiene, which uses materials provided by the Bible Society.

Etiene explains that many people who come to the hospital recognize their need for healing,

both physically and spiritually. He tells his patients, "The power of God is real. God can transform and heal. We teach people how to read the Bible and how to trust it." He says that people in the hospital are the most open to the Scripture's ability to transform their lives. He has seen many people within the walls

of Gitega Hospital put their faith in Christ.

While there is a small number of Bibles at the hospital, most patients leave without a Bible of their own. "Many people who come here are thirsty to read the Bible," he says. "They beg us to give them one. But we do not have the [financial] means to give them all a Bible. We just don't have enough." His dream is that all the patients who are discharged from the hospital could be given a copy of God's Word, the ultimate source of healing and transformation.








# A Bible Reading Reviva

hat if a program existed in which key readings helped you understand the full narrative import and message of the Bible?

Such a program came to life last summer, when more than 130 churches in the greater Philadelphia area tested the American Bible Society's newly sponsored The Essential 100 (E100). E100 uses 100 key Scripture passages to provide a comprehensive overview of God's involvement in history.

More than 12,400 people, representing diverse denominations and socio-economic backgrounds, committed to reading the Bible with their church. Everyone was enthusiastic and positive.

Barbara Dougherty, a member of Calvary Temple in Philadelphia, explained that her whole church got involved. The children used the program as part of their Christian education curriculum. For her, "the involvement of the entire congregation really helped me stay on track."

One goal of the E100 is to avoid the "Genesis to Revelation," or so-called snowplow approach to reading the Bible. Developed with funding support from the American Bible Society, the E100 contains 50 Scripture passages each from the Old and New Testaments. The E100 program allows people to work at their own pace, through a church or small group, by providing the support and motivation that helps people finish.

Whitney Kuniholm, president of Scripture Union/USA and the chief architect of the E100, hopes that this program will help spark a "Bible reading revival" resulting in churches that are more passionate about God and more loving toward their neighbors.

Church of the Good Samaritan in Paoli, Pa. He started out strong but hit a dry patch in his spiritual life and stopped reading. "Everyone in my church finished the E100, and I was still in the Old Testament," he says. "But that is the good thing about this program. It doesn't matter if you fall behind, you can still pick it up at anytime and finish it."

"What happens when people start to read the Bible? They begin to realize that God is at work in history and in the lives of individual people," he says. "When people begin to connect their story with God's story, that is when the Bible comes alive."

Brian Robbins, 16 years old, participated through his youth group at the

And Brian intends to do just that. Reenergized and excited about engaging in God's Word, he says, "Over the past few months, God has really showed me what he wants to do with my life. I am really looking forward to the future, and really digging into the Bible by completing the E100 program."


